ARTICIPATION IN THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA STORMWATE MONITORING COALITION

THIS AGREEMENT, for purposes of identification numbered D13-014, is made and 3 entered into this 15^{10} day of JANWAYM, 2018, by and between the County of Orange, the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, the County of San Diego, the Ventura Count Watershed Protection District, the Riverside County Flood Control and Water 6 Conservation District, the San Bernardino County Flood Control District, the City of Long Beach, the City of Los Angeles, the City of San Diego, the Regional Water Quality 8 Control Board - Los Angeles Region (Los Angeles Regional Board), the Regional Water Ouality Control Board - Santa Ana Region (Santa Ana Regional Board), the Regional Water Quality Control Board - San Diego Region (San Diego Regional Board), the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), the California Department of Transportation (CALTRANS), and the Southern California Coastal Water Research Project (SCCWRP). These entities are hereinafter sometimes jointly referred to as the "PARTIES" and individually as "PARTY". The County of Orange, the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, the County of San Diego, the Ventura County Watershed Protection District, the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, the San Bernardino County Flood Control District, the City of Long Beach, the City of Los Angeles, and the City of San Diego are sometimes jointly referred to as "MUNICIPAL PARTIES". These MUNICIPAL PARTIES with CALTRANS are sometimes referred to as "FUNDING PARTIES" and individually referred to as "FUNDING PARTY".
